

Community Development Block Grants and the Arts

Update

Since the publication of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Federal Funding Resource Guide in 2006, the budget levels for CDBG funding have fluctuated. Most recently, the budget for FY 2012 reduced funding for the CDBG Program by 7.5% or \$300 million relative to funding levels in FY 2011. The budget for FY 2013 maintains the 2012 CDBG funding levels. Approximately \$2.94 billion in funds in FY 2013 have been allocated for CDBG entitlement and non-entitlement activities.

Established in 1974, CDBG is one of the oldest programs administer through HUD. The CDBG program awards annual grants based on a formula basis to 1209 general units of local government and States.³

• Creative Portland Cooperation: Assets for Artists, Portland, ME: Since 2008, Assets for Artists has piloted an innovative matched savings grant program and financial and business training opportunities for low- to moderate-income artists. Initially launched in Berkshire County, Assets for Artists broadened its scope in 2011 to provide opportunities to artists throughout Massachusetts, with further expansion in 2012-2013 into Portland, Maine; New York City; and Rhode Island.

• Living Arts, Detroit, MI: Living Arts exists to strengthen the urban neighborhoods of Southwest Detroit by cultivating an environment that sparks the imagination and fosters ingenuity through the arts and community development initiatives. At the heart of the Living Arts mission is the belief that the mastery of artistic skills should benefit individual creative pursuit and help to develop the broader community. Today, their commitment to youth development and cultural enrichment significantly impacts Southwest Detroit.

• CityArts Community Youth Arts Afterschool Program, Providence, RI: CityArts Community Youth Arts Afterschool Program allowed 575+ of Providence's most challenged youth ages 8-14 to have free open access to quality arts learning during afterschool and summers between July 2012 and May 2013. The CDBG supported of \$15,000 covers 7% of the costs, and was used to augment Program salaries and administrative expenses for year-round access to CityArts programming.

2011-2012

• New Urban Arts, Providence, RI: New Urban Arts purchased 705 Westminster Street, a 4,200 square foot commercial space in excellent structural condition. It is accessible to youth from diverse neighborhoods and allows for a safe, gang-neutral space. With CDBG support, New Urban Arts intends to transform the vacant space into a vibrant facility serving at-risk youth and local artists. It hopes to be an engine of economic and cultural activity in an emerging business and cultural hub, and to encourage public participation in the arts. Over 500 at-risk youth, over 20 artists and over 2,000 visitors will be served through free youth programs, artist residencies, and public programs.

• New Orleans African American Museum/Expansion of Tremé Facility, New Orleans, LA: NOAAM has presented art and cultural exhibitions in the Tremé neighborhood since its founding in 2000. With \$3 million in CDBG funds, the museum will perform maintenance on the building's antique architecture that has suffered from storm damage, including repairing the outdoor stairway to the second story of the servant quarters. Additionally, the museum will perform necessary updates, including the installation of an elevator.

• Fox Theatre, McCook, NE: The City of McCook and the Alliance for the Encouragement of the Visual and Performing arts used CDBG funds to remove material and architectural barriers within the historic Fox Theatre. The project includes a variety of renovations, including adding wheelchair accessible seating, ventilating and air conditioning system, and providing ramp access to the stage. Additional matching funds were used to complete the project.

• Valley Cinema, Ord, NE: The City of Ord used CDBG funds to rehabilitate and convert the existing historic Valley Cinema into a theater that also accommodates theatrical and cultural presentations, plays, music events, comedy shows, speakers, charity auctions, and other events. the project will include converting the theater to a live performance venue, including constructing dressing rooms, restoring the stage and orchestra pit, modernizing lighting and sound systems, restoring the theater lobby and concession areas, installing a large retractable screen and widening restrooms and walkways. Additional matching funds were used to complete the project.

It is intended to house the Visitor's Bureau, Pro Arts Collective, Inc., and Capital City African-American Chamber of Commerce.
